Tembenukani School

The school was closed from March until the middle of September. Memo has been busy making face masks as all the children and staff have to wear them and have their temperature checked when they arrive at school.

In the 11 years since the school started it has grown way beyond all expectations - from a few children in the house porch to a 5 classroom school with well over 150 children! This has brought more management pressures to the organization, and Abigail's expertise is in teaching and training teachers. For sometime now she has been working with another charity 'Arise Africa' who have been supporting some of her children and helping with the feeding program. From January this charity will be taking on some of the management tasks of the school. Abigail will continue to be 'head teacher' at Tembenukani but will also help with the training of teachers in other schools which 'Arise Africa' run or support. We hope this will prove beneficial for both organizations. The charity is also building a new secondary school and Tembenukani will one of the feeder schools for this and they have named this new school 'The MacDonald Brown School' in recognition of the work Don, Christine and Abigail have done in Lusaka.
